Empower Northern Utah Light Bulb Exchange

Weber State University's sustainability team, in partnership with others, is offering new, energy-efficient LED light bulbs in exchange for old incandescent and CFL bulbs.

Households can exchange up to 15 bulbs for free through the Empower Northern Utah Light Bulb Exchange program September 7 – November 16. Each LED bulb can save residents up to \$12 a year. Exchanging 15 bulbs could cut annual utility costs by more than \$100. LED bulbs use far less energy than traditional bulbs. Unlike CFL bulbs, LED bulbs contain no mercury. Bring old bulbs for exchange to:

- **WSU Community Education Center** (2605 Monroe Blvd) Wednesdays, September 11 through November 13, 5-7p.m.
- **Weber County Library Main Campus** (2464 Jefferson Ave) Saturdays, September 14 through November 16, 11 a.m.-1p.m.

LED bulb supplies are limited; exchanges will take place while supplies last.

Disposing of Fall Leaves

When leaves start to fall, it will be time to start thinking about what to do with them. Be aware while raking leaves this fall that it is a violation of illegal dumping and waterway blocking ordinances to sweep or push leaves into the gutter or onto the street. Fallen leaves can plug storm drains and will cause ice dams to form in the gutters when the weather freezes. Keep the gutter in front of your home clean. Dispose of green waste from seasonal yard cleanup such as branches, leaves and grass clippings at Ogden City's Green Waste Facility (1845 Monroe Blvd). Residents who are unable to take their leaves to the Green Waste Facility should consider asking relatives, neighbors or friends to assist them.

Emergency Preparedness: Wildfires

Cool spring weather helps grass grow tall, which becomes a fire hazard as the grass dries out toward the end of summer and the beginning of fall. Here are ways to prepare a home to survive if its ever caught in a wildfire.

- **Prepare at home:** Have a fire extinguisher on hand and teach family members where it's kept and how to use it. Have an evacuation plan, communications plan, meeting place and an updated 72-hour kit ready to go. Make sure the home address is visible from the street. Keep fire hydrants unobstructed and be aware of any burning restrictions in the area.
- **Fortify against embers:** Clean roofs and gutters of outdoor debris. Replace or repair any loose or missing shingles, damaged or loose window screens and any broken windows. Install 1/8" metal mesh screening in the eaves of vents. Screen or box-in areas below patios and decks with wire mesh to prevent combustible materials from accumulating.
- **Avoid putting flammable items in dangerous places:** Remove anything stored underneath decks or porches. Move mulch, leaves and needles, firewood piles and any other flammable material away from wall exteriors. Landscape with fire-resistive plants and create small fuel breaks with hardscaping features. Create defensible space by pruning low-hanging tree branches and thinning trees and brush within 30 feet of a residence.
