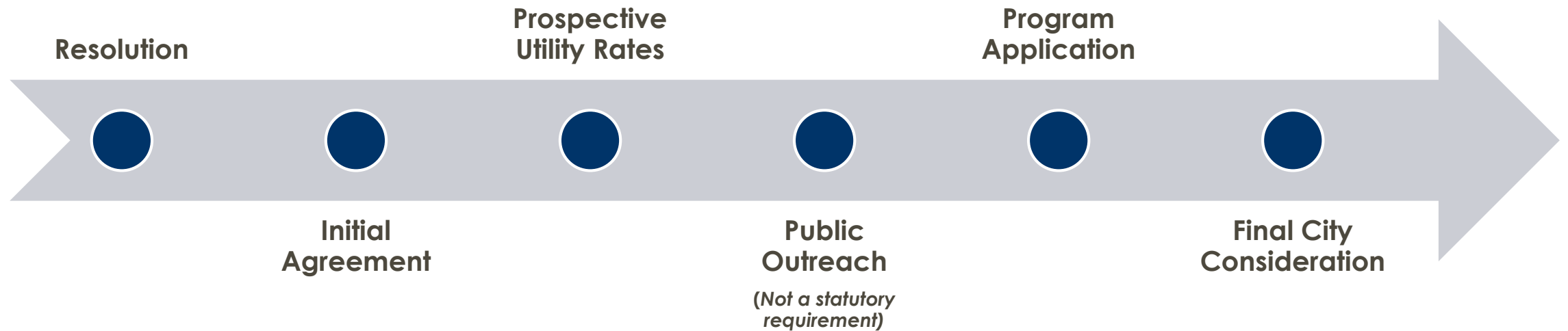

- ▶ Consider a different net-100% renewable electric energy goal (2035, 2040, 2050, etc.)
- ▶ Separate partnership with Rocky Mountain Power
- ▶ U.S. Department of Energy federal grants
- ▶ Increase Utah Energy Wise Communities focus/resources
- ▶ City solar power program
- ▶ Energy master plan
- ▶ Coordinate with the Natural Resources & Sustainability Stewardship Committee to develop additional options
