## Your Business Could Be Eligible for Funding

To support businesses impacted by COVID-19, Ogden City shifted its existing loan programs into a new **Emergency Loan Fund (ELF)**. The ELF was established with a generous donation from R&O

Construction and supported by other donors, including Ogden Industrial Development Corporation, Wadman Corporation, Marketstar, Utah Certified Development Company, Goldenwest Credit Union, and DL Evans Bank.

Jason Davis, who manages the Ogden Business Information Center (BIC), said Ogden was uniquely situated because of its existing loan programs designed to support local businesses. "Support has always been the goal of our program. We've been focused on helping not only the smaller, family-owned businesses but also some of the larger local businesses recognized as keystones of the community that employs people in the Ogden area," Davis said.

- Self-nominations will not be considered

## Your Area May Be Restricted From Open Fires and Fireworks

Fire restrictions are in effect from now until September 20th, or until conditions improve for the areas currently restricted. The Ogden City Fire Marshal has determined that existing environmental

conditions have created a significant hazard to property and public safety in the event of a fire in mountainous, brush covered, forest covered, and dry grass covered areas in the City. It has been concluded that a dry spring has created an earlier than normal "extreme" fire danger.

Data from the National Weather Service shows that precipitation along the Wasatch Front was well below normal for March, April, and May of 2020. The long-range forecast for the Ogden area indicates temperatures averaging in the upper 90's for the remainder of June and most of July, with no or very little precipitation expected.

Section 15A-5-202.5 of the Utah Code allows for the prohibition of use of an ignition source when hazardous environmental conditions are present. To see if your area is restricted please visit:

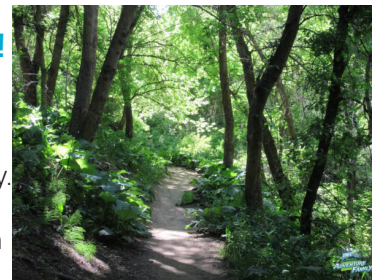
### Volunteers Needed on Ogden Trails

### Emergency Preparedness: Equip your Car

**It's important to prepare your family vehicle(s) for any situation that may occur.** When equipping your vehicle with items, keep in mind any emergency or everyday occurrences that may come up, or any items that may be needed to changes in weather or seasons.

Some basic items to include for common situations could be:

- **Blankets**
- **Heavy-duty flashlights**
- **A container of drinking water**
- **A collapsible shovel**
- **A basic first-aid kit**
- **Jumper cables**

Additional less-common items could be high-energy snack bars and weather-conscious clothing items. It's a good idea to include a sharp-pointed rock hammer within the driver's reach.
