FORECASTED BELOW FREEZING TEMPERATURES AT OGD AIRPORT FOR THE NEXT TWO WEEKS

Sustained below freezing temperatures will cause water pipes to freeze if water does not move for long periods of time. Turning the water faucet on slightly during the coldest hours can prevent the water in the pipes from freezing. Several hangar owners have purchased hay bales to place above the water meter.

Below is an email from the Ogden City water department:

Good afternoon, given that we have been experiencing a lot of cold weather of recent I wanted to remind you about the meters and service lines that have frozen in years past. To try and prevent freezing to some of these shallow waterlines it would probably wise to reach out to some of the hangar owners to let them know that if water sit still for too long and isn't moving at all, the lines will freeze. We just wanted to send you a friendly reminder in an effort to prevent any potential freezing damage for this winter.
